BioZone Scientific's Conflict Minerals Policy

To Whom it May Concern:

As a company that is committed to corporate social responsibility, BioZone Scientific intends to fully comply with the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the "Act") and the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") rules and regulations. Under Section 1502 of the Act and the SEC's final rules, BioZone Scientific must publicly disclose its use of tantalum, tin, tungsten, and gold ("Conflict Minerals") and whether these Conflict Minerals originated in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries (collectively the "Conflict Region").

BioZone Scientific uses a variety of metals in the electronic components and products that we manufacture, including metals that are the same variety as Conflict Minerals. The supply chain for these metals is complex and BioZone Scientific is undertaking reasonable due diligence in our supply chain to ensure that these metals are not sourced from this Conflict Region.

BioZone Scientific expects its suppliers to adhere to the Electronic Industry Code of Conduct (<u>www.eicc.info</u>) and to source these metals only from socially and environmentally responsible sources.

BioZone Scientific and our suppliers do not knowingly use any metals originating from Conflict Mines. BioZone Scientific regularly questions our supply chain to ensure these Conflict Minerals are not used.
